Solar Panel training October 18 North Java EVOC October 25, 27,30 Pike

- *New Firefighter I in effect now. Another scheduled with BEFO in spring.
- *New Firefighter II will be offered after November 1.
- *Working on Fire ground responsibilities of the Incident Commander. Trying to bring it into the county. No charge. Limited to 24 people, 16 hour class. Friday, Saturday, Sunday, or Saturday and Sunday.
- *Hazmat did respond with Perry/Perry Center for a boat fire at Silver Lake, along with DEC.
- *Vital Signs conference coming up. October 13-16 in Syracuse.
- *Old air compressor at training center available. See Bill
- *Old SUV went to Silver Springs as high bidder.
- *Burn room at the tower has been repaired. Back working well.
- *Busy July and August for working fires. (11 total)
- *Grain Bin training went well. 35 participated. Still looking at manure pit storage training in February.
- *FEMA grant opens October 11 and ends November 18.
- *Medic 81 not up and running much at this time. Hopefully soon up to speed.
- *Portal training. Looking at Cowlesville, Perry, Arcade. Pilot through rest of county.
- *New York Resuscitation Symposium to be held November 5 from 9-3:30 at the Seneca Gambling Resort and Casino. Cost is \$20.
- *EMS training on Orthopedic Trauma is November 30 at Wyoming County business center or DSS. $1\frac{1}{2}-2$ hour class free of charge.
- **Narcan providers in Wyoming County: Attica, Bennington, Warsaw, Strykersville, Pike, Gainesville. These departments are registered/licensed to provide this and carry it.

- *Inject NY providers in Wyoming County: EMS can draw shots for epi pens. Pens cost \$750 and expire. Injection cost about \$75-80 only. Huge savings. Departments that can administer this are: Varysburg, Warsaw, Attica, Cowlesville, Gainesville, Harris Corners, Strykersville
- *Remember that all responders need training. TEACH AND TRAIN!!
- *Active shooter response program in Wyoming County update: Sheriff continues to train their personnel, but looking at next year. Also working with preparedness center and Montour falls. Go on line to check out more training.
- *Sitting down with instructors to get training schedule made up. Trying to do more in house training.
- *Next week is fire prevention week. Landis talked about his program in Arcade. He's been doing this for the past 20 years. He has a police officer come with his guys. Seems to be cutting down on fires. Try and get out there and teach.
- *A lot of power strip fires lately.
- *Primo would like everyone to go back and push this solar panel class October 18 at North Java. Chief's to pay part of the registration fee.
